



Commitment to Duty of Care

Alaska REALTORS® takes great pride in **Our Duty of Care** for the health, safety and well-being of its members and the public attending our sanctioned events. Therefore, we are committed to mitigating risk and expect event attendees to be accountable for safe conduct while attending any of our events.

Our Duty of Care is based on the needs specific to the 2021 Alaska REALTORS® Convention, September 29 – October 2, 2021 in Homer, Alaska. This is a living document and will evolve as relevant measures, such as; face coverings, social distancing, sanitizing stations, and visual safety reminders, among others become necessary. Alaska REALTORS® will continue to monitor and adjust.

Personal Accountability Commitment

By attending the Alaska REALTORS® Convention, you will be asked to participate in and agree to abide by health and safety protocols implemented onsite while in attendance. This includes, but is not limited to, wearing a face-covering when required by the US Centers for Disease Control (CDC) or venue, providing vaccine status or proof of a negative PCR test (if required by venue), adhering to social distance protocols, and following relevant CDC, state and local government guidance and/or orders.

- **Face Coverings (if needed)** - In accordance with updated health and safety guidelines from the CDC, all attendees are required to wear face coverings in all indoor locations, regardless of vaccination status. If you do not have your own face covering(s), one will be provided. If you cannot wear a face mask, a face shield is required.
- **Hand Sanitizer** - The event venue will provide ample hand sanitization stations throughout the event spaces, sanitizer available in the event registration area, and provided to individuals.
- **Socially Distance Event Planning** - We will partner with the Land's End Resort to provide reasonable seating. Well-being protocols will be in place for catered events.
- **CODE OF CONDUCT** - We will adhere to the Events Industry Council guidelines for conducting safe in-person meetings and events outlined below. If you are attending an in-person gathering, you indicate you agree to comply with these guidelines.

Before Leaving Home

- Evaluate personal health and the people you are in close contact with; contact the meeting/event organizers if you have concerns or believe you may have been exposed to Covid-19.

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On-site During the Event

- Follow relevant guidance provided by the CDC and state and local orders for everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses including:
 - ✓ All attendees must wear a mask or facial covering indoors at all times, unless eating or drinking. If you are opposed to a mask or have a medical reason preventing you, consider the virtual option.
 - ✓ Adhere to social distance protocols put in place by the event organizers.
 - ✓ Notify the event First Aid office (or equivalent) at any time if you feel unwell or are experiencing any covid symptoms.
 - ✓ Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or an alcohol-based sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
 - ✓ Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
 - ✓ Cover your nose/mouth when coughing or sneezing. Dispose of tissues immediately.
 - ✓ Clean/disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces with regular household cleaning spray or disinfecting wipe.
 - ✓ Daily Check in with thermal temperature scan.
 - ✓ Hotel staff will be masked and all food will be served by them – there will be no buffet style food.
 - ✓ Respecting personal space is crucial. Choose your comfort level:
 - Green** - I'm comfortable around people and not concerned with physical distance. Handshakes and hugs ok.
 - Yellow** - Cautious please - elbow bumps only.
 - Red** - Kindly don't get into my social bubble.

Post-event

- Monitor your health for up to 14-days for any symptoms of COVID-19. Refer to the CDC website for the current list of symptoms.
